

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Mission

The primary objective of SIDS and Kids SA is to support families who experience the sudden and unexpected death of their baby or child during pregnancy, birth, infancy and childhood, through the provision of bereavement support, education, advocacy and the promotion of research.

We deliver on our mission through providing a 24 hour, 365 days a year crisis outreach service as well as ongoing bereavement support for families following the sudden and unexpected death of an infant or young child from conception to 6 years. We also provide safe sleeping education to the South Australian Community in an effort to prevent death from unsafe sleeping environments.



What we do

The Sudden Infant Death Syndrome Association of South Australia Inc, trading as SIDS and Kids SA, was formed by a group of parents in October 1977. The main aim was to raise funds for research and to support bereaved families whose infants had died from Cot Death now known as Sudden Infant Death Syndrome.

Research led to evidence based education programs which significantly reduced the risk of SIDS and allowed our organisation to broaden its charter to provide support for families who experience the sudden and unexpected death of a child during pregnancy, infancy and childhood, up to six years of age.

Our education programs now encompass sleeping baby safely from birth up to one year of age.

This year we received a bequest from Miss Patricia Dawn Lambden, which is the first time that anyone can recall such a generous gesture being made to SIDS and Kids SA. We had no known links or affiliation with Miss Lambden, but gratefully received part proceeds of her estate.

We farewelled Jaylee Cooper from the organisation and wished her well in her new challenge with Novita. Kate Chapley joined as Fundraising and Events Manager and has brought fresh vision and new ideas in our fundraising ventures.

In last year's report I committed to seek out grant opportunities to support the great work we do and I'm very pleased to report that we were successful in receiving almost \$70,000 in grants for projects, including a brand new Toyota Corolla for our Counsellors to use from the SA Government.

Education

The 2016/2017 year has seen continuing relationships with stakeholders such as maternity hospitals, Department of Education and Child Development and Child and Family Health but 2016/2017 has seen a significant increase in the number of childcare presentations conducted. This is likely to continue through to 2017/2018. Relationships built with the key stakeholders in this area (Australian Childcare Alliance SA, Community Children's Centres SA and Stepping Stone SA) has resulted in a big uptake of our safe infant sleeping information sessions for childcare professionals.

In terms of community events and expos, I attended the Parents, Babies and Children's expo and the Shine for Indie community event. Both were very successful in terms of the numbers of people visiting our stand and the expo saw great attendances at our daily safe sleeping presentations.

Counselling and Bereavement Support

A total of 19 groups were held this year for Mothers, Fathers, and Twins families including groups for mothers bereaved by stillbirth. This also included a bereaved Mothers morning tea in May, a Father's Day evening in September and candle making workshop prior to Infant loss awareness day in October.

This year the annual family picnic for bereaved families was attended by 25 people in November.

We also supported the placement of a student studying a Masters in Counselling at the University of Adelaide.

Four presentations were given during the year. One to a child care centre following the death of a child that attended the centre and another to Midwives at University of SA. The third lecture provided was to 2nd year counselling students at Tabor College on grief and loss, and the fourth presentation was professional development for Neonatal Nurses at the Women's & Children's Hospital.



The brochure "The First 48 Hours" has been developed further with other agencies in South Australia to provide immediate information to families after the loss of a child in hospital.

Fundraising and Events

An ever-increasing demand for our Safe Sleep education programs and bereavement counselling service means that SIDS and Kids SA must continue to identify new opportunities for fundraising, to maintain and grow existing fundraising activities and to develop new channels for raising awareness of SIDS and Kids SA and its services.



SIDS and Kids SA Events 2016/17



The Australia and New Zealand Institute for Insurance and Finance chose SIDS and Kids SA as the official charity partner for their Charity Lunch in May 2016. The biggest social and networking event for the insurance industry in South Australia, the generosity of the 300+ attendees raised \$8,557.51 to help us fund our services. Thank you to Lisa McAskill and Lucy Cornes for presenting and to our team of volunteers for running raffles and auctions.

Thank you also to bereaved parent Kirsty Owens for nominating SIDS and Kids SA as the charity partner. The opportunity to piggyback off existing events is priceless, creating awareness of what we do to a new audience and expanding the scope of our fundraising. SIDS and Kids SA has limited resources to run events – being given the opportunity to fundraise at an event run by another organisation is of incredible value to us.



Movie Night

Over 300 people attended to watch "Ab Fab" and just over \$7,500 was raised, primarily through raffles and bar.









2016 Red Nose Day

Red Nose Day remains our major fundraising and awareness raising event of the year.

The 2016 Red Nose Day raised \$51,232.64 gross.

- 22 Shopping Centres raised over \$25,000 (over 2 weeks).
- Four highest fundraising schools raised over \$4,500 between them.
- POS Box orders were about a third of the 2016's orders and raised around \$10,000.

Quiz Night

After two sell out years, the Quiz Night was moved to the Thebarton Community Centre to accommodate additional guests.

310 people attended and \$17,667.68 was raised.



Entertainment Books

SIDS and Kids SA again sold Entertainment Books to raise funds. Our supporters got behind this fundraiser wholeheartedly, with \$1965.45 being raised.

Community Fundraising

It is only with the support of our communities that SIDS and Kids SA can continue to run our Safe Sleep Education programs and free bereavement counselling service. Usually bereaved parents or their friends and family hold fundraisers to honour the memory of their child. As SIDS and Kids SA has a very small staff, any amount raised by a Community Fundraiser is appreciated – from the local childcare centre who raises \$100 to the social club that raises amounts in the thousands of dollars.

Fundraising will always be paramount to the service provision we are able to provide for the SA Community. We are committed to maintaining our existing relationships and further developing our relationships with the community.
